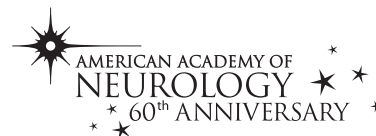

WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

Dystonia and spasticity are chronic neurological disorders characterized by sustained muscle contractions that frequently cause twisting or repetitive movements and abnormal—sometimes painful—postures or positions. Botulinum toxin is playing an increasingly important role in the management of these disorders.

For these workshops, expert faculty will introduce residents and fellows to the basic pharmacology of botulinum toxin and its treatment techniques for dystonia and spasticity in both adults and children.
