## Recipient Will Receive

- Certificate of recognition and \$500 prize

## Eligibility

- Must be a fellow or faculty member at an academic level up to assistant professor
- Must have demonstrated commitment and preliminary evidence of productivity to establish career potential in clinical neuro-oncology research
- Must be no greater than five years from end of training (residency, fellowship, or post graduate training for advanced academic degree)
- Basic science career neuro-oncologists are also eligible
- The winner should attend the Neuro-oncology Section meeting, if possible, to receive the award
- The winner must give consent to have a short biosketch placed on the Preuss website as an award winner
